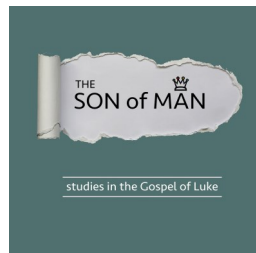
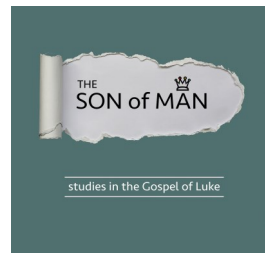


The Feast at the End of the World

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Questions for Discussion and Reflection:

- 2) Why did the first group of invitees not come to the feast? What excuses do people make today to avoid the invitation to the Kingdom of God?
- 3) How did the master *feel* in response to the excuses? What does that tell you about God?
- 4) What did the master *do* in response to the excuses? What does that tell you about God?
- 5) Read Matthew 22:1-14. What does that parable have in common with this one from Luke 14? What are the differences?
- 6) Describe the point of the parable in your own words.
- 7) Pray that the Holy Spirit would help you surrender your excuses and embrace the invitation of His wonderful grace.

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
